

SYLLABUS – Wintersession 2006  
**MATH 115 – ELEMENTARY STATISTICS**

**Required Materials:**

1. SOFTWARE:     *Adventure Learning Systems: Statistics* by Hawkes Systems.
2. TEXT:         *Beginning Statistics* by Warren, Denley, and Atchley  
                    The text may be purchased at the bookstore in the student union.
3. CALCULATOR: A graphing calculator with a statistical package is required for this course. A TI-83 is the recommended calculator.

**TESTS:**

1. There will be two (2) major tests during the course. Each test will count 300 points. The format of the tests is at the discretion of the instructor.
2. There will be a 100-point software/homework grade. The instructor will assign lessons from *Adventure Learning Systems: Statistics*. **NO LATE CERTIFICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED!** See the instructions at the end of this syllabus for how to use the Hawkes software and print certificates. Additional homework assignments will be given from the text. Each software and homework assignment is worth 10 points.

**FINAL GRADE:** The final grade will be based on the following criteria:

Each instructor will notify the class regarding the policy of leaving class early or coming into the classroom late. Students arriving late or coming in early are likely to miss important class announcements. Students must take the responsibility of telling the instructor in advance if they must leave early and must discuss with the instructor immediately after class if they entered the classroom after class had begun. Note that it is the student's responsibility to make sure their attendance record is correct.

**VERY IMPORTANT:**

1. If a test or quiz is missed for ANY reason, a grade of 0 will be given. There will be no make-up tests or quizzes given except for University approved functions.
2. Any person who must miss a scheduled test and/or quiz because of an official University function must reschedule and take this test and/or quiz at a time BEFORE the test and/or quiz is scheduled to be given. NO OTHER rescheduling will be allowed.
3. NO late assignments are to be accepted for ANY reason. If a student is unable to attend class, they must make arrangements to hand in assignments prior to the class meeting in which they are due.
4. An "I" grade will not be given without the permission of the Department of Mathematics.
5. If a student wishes to discuss the grading policy, the testing policy, or have any conversation regarding the instructor of the course, please make an appointment with the course supervisor in the Department of Mathematics.

**CHEATING:** The following statement is the policy in Math 115 for the Department of Mathematics on cheating:

**OFFENSES:** Cheating on any exam, quiz, work to be completed in class; cheating on final examination; theft or attempted theft of exam questions or possession of exam questions prior to the time of the examination shall all be offenses subject to appropriate penalties.
